She also will talk about the forgotten Black communities Lynwood/Macedonia/Johnstown/etc.

Victoria is also the Communications Chair for Historic Atlanta, a volunteer-run organization with a deep well of technical expertise in conservation, real estate, finance, law, federal and state compliance, public history, and documentation.


Peachtree Heights East Walking Tour

Buckhead Heritage Executive Director Richard Waterhouse and Caleb Brown will offer a fascinating tour of this hidden neighborhood near Peachtree Road and Lindbergh Drive. With approximately 330 homes within this unique neighborhood, houses in Peachtree Heights East include early 20th century American two story four-square, Craftsman Bungalow, Cape Cod, Tudor Revival, Mission Revival, and Ranch to 21st century home styles. We will see examples of several of those on the tour. The mile and a half tour route is hilly and the tour will last about an hour and a half. We ask participants to stay on the road during the tour.


Two Inspiring Members Recently Lost

In 2004, I received a phone call from Belle Turner Lynch, a neighbor whom I had never met. Over iced tea and refreshments in her elegant home, Belle enumerated her concerns about tear-downs in the Peachtree Heights West neighborhood, and described a possible solution under the City of Atlanta's Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 20, which regulates Historic and Landmark Districts. That meeting resulted

in an eighteen month effort to have PHW become an Historic District. A leadership group was formed, and many other neighbors participated by hosting about 20 meetings to explore the possibility. While the effort ultimately failed, Wright Mitchell, a key member of the effort and the founder of Buckhead Heritage, reminded me after Belle's passing on May 13, 2021, that the founding of BH grew from that effort, one initiated by Belle Turner Lynch.

Buckhead Heritage is working to preserve and protect New Hope AME Church Cemetery by enhancing the community, embracing the cultural landscape, and generating increased interest in the cemetery. Combined, these efforts provide a sense of place and history for the neighborhood. This major 2021 collaborative cleanup and renovation project includes Peachtree United Methodist Church, New Hope Church members, and neighbors.
