

November Speaker Series: Dr. Mason Lowance, *History of Race Relations in the Jim Crow Era*

Buckhead resident and author Dr Mason Lowance will speak about the history of racism in the Jim Crow era. Professor Lowance has written several books on slavery, and teaches Early American Literature, American Romanticism, and American Realism at the University of Massachusetts – Amherst. Mason is a native Atlantan who grew up in Buckhead and completed his undergraduate studies at Princeton University, received a master’s degree in English Literature at the University of Oxford in England, and his Ph. D. from Emory University.

Buckhead Hidden History

Hidden away in the parking lot of the building at 2970 Peachtree Road, Northwest is a gas light and plaque. It reads "Site of Early Real Estate Investment by ROY LECRAW, MAYOR OF ATLANTA 1941, memorialized by BUCKHEAD COALITION, INC. as a symbol to his VISION and FAITH in his community, December 2002, Atlanta Gas Light."

Roy LeCraw, May 1, 1895 - February 21, 1985, was a confident and outspoken leader who excelled in insurance, and was an officer in the National Guard. He was a charter member and President of the Atlanta Junior Chamber of Commerce in 1924. He later served as president of the


Atlanta Chamber in 1932, and ran for Atlanta Mayor in 1934. He was soundly defeated by James. L. Key.

The next Mayor, William B. Hartsfield, was worried that many of the best leaders in Atlanta were moving to the suburbs, and thought a labor-friendly candidate such as Roy LeCraw would be popular. Hartsfield started the campaign to annex Buckhead into the City of Atlanta.

In September 1942 LeCraw defeated Hartsfield by 111 votes. But his tenure as Mayor was short lived; he resigned in May 1942 to join the Army. After returning from the war, Lecraw served as a state senator.

For those that enjoy wandering through cemeteries to soak up history, Roy LeCraw is buried in Arlington Memorial Park, Sandy Springs.
