Buckhead Heritage Presents Two New Awards at Holiday Party

Buckhead Heritage President Charlotte Margolin, Past President John Beach, and Vice President E. Fay Pearce, Jr. presented two new awards at the Holiday Party.

First is the Belle Turner Lynch Preservation Award. This award is bestowed on distinguished individuals, nonprofit organizations, public agencies, and corporations whose skill and determination have given new meaning to their communities through preservation of their architectural and cultural heritage. These efforts include citizen attempts to save and maintain important landmarks; companies and craftsmen whose work restores the richness of the past; the vision of public officials who support preservation projects and legislation in their communities; and educators and journalists who help Americans understand the value of preservation.

Recipients for this year are:

Laura Dobson because she spearheaded efforts to preserve the 1929 National Library Bindery commercial building on Peachtree at Peachtree Battle designed by Ten Eyck Brown and Alfredo Barili, Jr.

Richard Lee, Branch Properties, because he worked with Laura to incorporate and protect the front portion of the bindery building in their development plans.

Aaron Taulbee, Kolter Urban, because he worked with Laura to further protect the front portion of the bindery building with a façade easement after they purchased the property from Branch Properties.

Second is the Bob Helget Award for Outstanding Volunteerism. This award is given to eligible candidates who are members and have demonstrated volunteer service that is conspicuously above and beyond the reasonably expected duties and responsibilities of a Buckhead Heritage volunteer.

Recipient for this year is:

Sara Ellen Porter, a retired bookkeeper, because she volunteered as the group's bookkeeper and accounting office specialist for the past 3 years, working in our Buckhead office, and also remotely during Covid.

George Washington's Eggnog By John Beach

Many people asked about Martha and George Washington's eggnog

recipe used for our December Holiday Party. Eggnog and forerunners like posset date back to at least the 16th century. It was prescribed for a cold to King George I in 1620, and Shakespeare wrote about it in Hamlet and The Merry Wives of Windsor.

In 1826 West Point cadets drunk on homemade eggnog rioted, breaking furniture and windows, and shooting at their commanding officer. 19 students were expelled, but not the later famous southern cadets Robert E. Lee and Jefferson Davis.

Long before refrigeration and DUI's the Washington's mixed:

- 1 quart cream
- 1 quart milk
- 1 dozen eggs beaten
- 12 tblsp sugar
- 1 pint Brandy
- ½ pint Rye whiskey
- ½ pint Jamaica rum
- 1/4 pint Sherry

And then they let it sit for several days "culturing". We used a pasteurized eggnog mix, adding to each quart 4 oz of egg custard and 2 oz cream, and then 1/3 of the above 4 liquors mixed to prevent rioting and expelling any members.


