Robert Ratonyi will talk about his experience as a childhood Holocaust survivor. Born in Budapest, Hungary in 1938, Robert's early childhood was scarred by fear, upheaval and loss. He was six-years old when forced to wear a yellow star and face the terrors of war and ghetto life without his parents, both of whom were deported.

Robert grew up under the communist dictatorship. He was a freshman at the Technical University of Budapest when he was caught up in the bloody uprising against the Communist regime in October, 1956. He managed to

escape to Austria following the uprising, and eventually ended up as an immigrant, first in in Montreal, Canada where he learned English, restarted his life and education, and then in the US. He has a Bachelor and a Master degree in engineering from MIT. He also received a business degree from Drexel University. Robert became an American citizen in 1969 and enjoyed a successful business career. He and his wife Eva, who is also a Holocaust survivor, have two children.

As a survivor of the Holocaust, he is a regular speaker on behalf of The Breman Holocaust Museum and the Georgia Commission on the Holocaust.

His book, From Darkness Into Light – My Journey Through Nazism, Fascism and Communism to Freedom was published in 2022. The story you will hear at the lecture is based on the first chapter of his book.

We will see examples of several of these on the tour. The mile-and-a-half route is hilly and will last about an hour-and-a-half. We will meet at the Duckpond's historical marker and stay on the road during the tour.

George Thomas Heery, Jr. Tribute

Buckhead Heritage is saddened by the loss of longtime member and supporter George Thomas Heery, Jr. George was an accomplished realtor and highly respected in the Buckhead area for his genuine, considerate and helpful nature. George was involved in many civic causes and was always ready to jump in and help advance the Buckhead Heritage mission. For example, George invited Buckhead Heritage members to tour the infamous "Tunnel Home" on Peachtree Battle that has been the subject of so much speculation over the years. George immediately knew that the home he was listing was one of historic importance and that our members would have a great interest in seeing it before it went on the market. More recently, George

helped Buckhead Heritage restore the historic name of Bagley Park by lobbying the Garden Hills Neighborhood Association to support the project. Given George's values, it is no surprise that he felt so strongly that the Bagley Park name should be restored and actively participated in the process to make that happen.

George always had a smile on his face and a wonderful "can do" spirit that we will greatly miss at Buckhead Heritage. More importantly, Buckhead and the City of Atlanta will miss his contributions as an engaged and active community leader. Our thoughts are with the entire Heery Family at this difficult time.

The Lodge

Buckhead Heritage is aware of the rumors surrounding the potential sale of The Lodge, a historic building located at the corner of Peachtree Battle Avenue and Peachtree

Road by the Atlanta Public School (APS) system. We have reached out to school board members and city council members to learn more information.

Dating back to 1909, The Lodge holds great cultural significance as it was part of the development of the Peachtree Heights West neighborhood. Esteemed New York-based architectural firm Carerre and Hastings, responsible for the layout of Peachtree Heights, may have designed the small building, which originally served as the development's sales office.

Peachtree Heights Development Company donated the land on the opposite corner for a public school. Originally named Peachtree Heights School, it was renamed E. Rivers Elementary School in 1926, honoring Rivers' service to the board of education and the broader community.

In 1929, Rivers arranged for Mary Hardwick Bloodsworth to establish a kindergarten in The Lodge, which operated there until the 1950s. Recognizing the historical value and significance of the building, Peachtree Heights Development Company, in 1937, deeded The Lodge to Fulton County for the nominal fee of \$1, stipulating that it should be used for a "museum, monumental, educational, park or other like purpose."

As a grass-roots advocacy organization committed to safeguarding Buckhead's rich historical resources, Buckhead Heritage looks forward to working collaboratively with APS to develop a comprehensive plan for the preservation of this significant building.

Buckhead Heritage is working with neighborhood associations to ensure that the wishes of Peachtree Heights Development Company are carried out.

The image above of The Lodge is from The American Architect, Volume CIV, 1968, and the original photograph was taken September 10, 1913.
