Speaker Series: Jeff Clemmons Rich's: A Southern Institution

Thursday, November 16, 2023, 7:00 p.m., Free
The Cathedral of Saint Philip Gould Room

Jeff Clemmons will share stories from his book *Rich's: A Southern Institution.* In 1867, less than three years after the Civil War left the city in ruins, Hungarian Jewish immigrant Morris Rich opened a small dry goods store on what is now Peachtree Street in downtown Atlanta.

Over time, his brothers Emanuel and Daniel joined the business; within a century, it became a retailing dynasty. Join historian Jeff Clemmons as he traces Rich's 137-year history. For the first time, learn the true stories behind Penelope Penn, Fashionata, The Great Tree, the Pink Pig, Rich's famous coconut cake and much more, including how events at the downtown store helped John F. Kennedy become America's thirty-fifth president. With an eye for accuracy and exacting detail, Clemmons recounts the complete history of this treasured southern institution.

Jeff Clemmons has a degree in business administration from Reinhardt University and a degree in creative writing and theater from Georgia State University. He created and conducts walking tours for the Atlanta Preservation Center, serves on the board of the East Point Historical Society, and is a cofounder of Marthasville, an Atlanta-based writing salon. In addition to writing two books – *Rich's: A Southern Institution* and *Atlanta's Historic Westview Cemetery* – and a screenplay, Jeff, along with three others, was nominated for an Emmy Award for producing Georgia Public Television's "Rich's Remembered." He is currently at work on his third book, a biography of forgotten Atlanta avant-garde novelist Frances Newman, who gained national attention alongside Hemingway and others in the 1920s.

Last week, a group of 17 dedicated volunteers came together for a three-hour training session led by Sue Verhoef, the Director of Oral History and Genealogy at the Atlanta History Center. The focus was to delve into the 'how to' of oral history interviewing, a crucial element in Buckhead Heritage's mission to preserve and promote our community's historic resources for the benefit of future generations.

The training session provided a comprehensive understanding of the do's and don'ts of conducting interviews. The highlight was the informative videos that Verhoef shared, which illustrated the nuances of the craft. The content not only made the learning experience enjoyable but also deepened our appreciation for the importance of an interview done well.

Through a series of mock interviews, we used the skills we had discussed. One invaluable lesson that stood out was the significance of not interrupting the narrator. As we learned, silence is golden in the world of oral history interviewing, allowing the storyteller to freely recount their memories and experiences.

Sue also gave us a tour of the Atlanta History Center's studio space, which is available to Buckhead Heritage for our Oral History program.

As we move forward, we invite all our supporters to join us in this enriching journey, whether through volunteering, contributing stories, or simply engaging with the history that makes Buckhead so unique.

Buckhead Board Member Mike Armstrong, Chairman of Children's Rehabilitation Center (CRC) gave the participants a tour of The Cator Woolford house and garden located in North Druid Hills. In the late 1940's, two Buckhead women, Ann Lane and Becky Frazer, saw the need for an organization that would help children with cerebral palsy. In 1952, the CRC purchased the Cator Woolford estate. The house became a school for children with cerebral palsy that would eventually become The Frazer Center whose current mission is a preschool for all children as well as those with disabilities. It also has a program for adults with

disabilities.
