
Buckhead Heritage 2023 Raffle Winners

Speaker Series: Jim Langford

Standing Peachtree: What We Know and Don't Know - Yet

Thursday, September 21, 2023, 7 p.m. Free

James B. Langford serves as president of the Coosawattee Foundation, a non-profit organization he created in 1987 to promote the conservation of Native American occupation sites and related Indigenous lands. In that role and as president of the Society for Georgia Archaeology, he worked closely with multiple tribal groups to research and author two landmark pieces of legislation that protect human remains and culturally significant sites in Georgia. The Coosawattee Foundation also works to educate the public and dispel stereotypes about Native American cultures.

Mr. Langford is a frequent lecturer about the early inhabitants of Georgia. He is the author and co-author of academic research related to the Mississippian period and early Spanish contact in Georgia. His co-authored work on Mississippian period ceramics has been used for more than 30 years as the

definitive research and laboratory ceramics guide for professional archaeologists and the general public.

Restoration Underway: Fallen Oak and Fencing at New Hope Church Cemetery

In August, a mature oak tree fell at New Hope Church Cemetery, damaging the fencing. Buckhead Heritage is partnering with New Hope Church and a local fencing company to restore the site. The project is expected to be completed by late September.

The restoration costs have been covered by previously secured funding, made possible through the generous contributions of local residents, businesses, and supporters of our New Hope Church Cemetery restoration campaign.

The New Hope A.M.E. Church Cemetery, situated on Arden Road in Buckhead, has been a central focus of Buckhead Heritage's preservation efforts since 2017. As a listed National Register of Historic Places site, it holds significance as a local African-American cemetery.

Buckhead Heritage extends a warm welcome to the community to stay informed about the restoration's progress. Updates and opportunities for community participation will be shared as they develop.

We will meet at the Duckpond's historical marker and stay on the road during the tour.
