Speaker Series: Bobby Jones Then & Now: The Evolution of Atlanta Memorial Park


Thursday, May 16, 7 p.m., Free Cathedral of Saint Philip Child Hall

Speaker Series: Prolific Atlanta artist Steve Steinman recaps his 50-year career

Thursday, July 18, 7 p.m., Free Cathedral of Saint Philip Gould Room

Steve Steinman is celebrating 50 years as one of the city's most prolific artists. Hear him speak on how he has integrated a range of mediums, from sculpture to photography, creating some of the city's most enduring pieces, including the colorful repeating sculpture patterns viewed by millions who pass through the Buckhead Marta station, as well as the Monument to Slain Police Officers in Woodruff Park.

Originally from New Jersey, Steinman began pursuing art at an early age. Known for his quick wit and humor, one of his earliest

accomplishments was winning a competition by satirically drawing a "Draw Me" match book in Andy Warhol style. He would go on to develop his talent at the Rhode Island School of Design (RISD) and the Pratt Institute, where he earned undergraduate and graduate degrees, before relocating to Atlanta to continue his career as both a working artist and an educator. Earning a doctorate in education from Capella University, Steinman also served as International Dean of the School of Design at the American InterContinental University in Buckhead, where he worked for 33 years.

Paces Ferry United Methodist Church Threatened

Buckhead Heritage is advocating for the preservation of the historic Paces Ferry United Methodist Church and the venerable tree that stands sentinel before it.

Established in 1877, Paces Ferry United Methodist Church was originally known as Pleasant Hill Methodist Church. It has been an integral part of Buckhead's narrative for nearly a century and a half.

Adjacent to the church lies the Pleasant Hill Cemetery, which holds the graveds of Civil War soldiers who died in a nearby battle, Buckhead families and William Brown, the man who donated the land for the church.

There is also the majestic tree that has stood witness to centuries of change. This towering Post Oak, dating back to at least the 1730s, predates even the founding of our nation.

The church is currently for sale, and Buckhead Heritage has learned that there are several interested parties, including some who wish to preserve it. Additionally, neighbors are actively working with the Methodist church to ensure the preservation of the adjacent cemetery.

"The church and its historic tree are not just relics of the past; they are touchstones that ground us in our shared heritage," said Buckhead Heritage President Ivan Allen. "They remind us of the pioneers who shaped our community, the struggles they faced, and the triumphs they achieved. To lose them would be to lose a part of ourselves."

Buckhead Heritage seeks to ensure that these treasures are safeguarded for future generations. Our mission is not only to preserve buildings and landmarks but also to foster a deep appreciation for our history within the community. We believe that by honoring our past, we enrich our present and lay the foundation for a more vibrant future.
